Dear Friends,

After a long wait finally, the churches are getting reopen at 15% capacity starting this Friday, June 11 just in time to celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus this coming Friday.

This means we can have about 130 people inside our church. With fewer people going to church now days this is almost good enough for us.

Of course, we still need to use sanitizer, wear masks and keep the social distancing. Hopefully in the beginning of July we will go to 25% capacity which will be very good for us.

Our weekend Masses and daily Masses will go back to our normal schedule starting this Friday, June 11. If you are looking for a Mass that is less busy, please consider the 5 pm Saturday Mass or the 8 am Sunday Mass. There should be a lot of room at those Masses. The 10 am Mass is a bit more busy but usually we have room at it as well.

The most busy Mass recently is the 12 noon Polish Mass. If you are coming to that Mass consider coming earlier as otherwise when we get to our limit you will not be able to come in.

You can still participate in this Mass outside by the main door of the church where we have some speakers and Holy Communion will be brought to you there.

Of course, we can celebrate the sacraments also at the same capacity limits. Soon we will be deciding how and when we will celebrate our 1st Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Our office is usually open from Monday to Thursday 9 am to 4 pm but it is better to call before you come to make sure somebody is here.

I will not be going through other details as by now we know how to behave and what to do.

I hope and pray that the churches, or in fact Ontario and Canada, will not have to go through another lockdown as this would be devastating to churches, our economy and society at large.

Of course, if you need any help with anything know that we are here for you.

Do not forget to support our parish spiritually and financially during these challenging times and we are very grateful for all your support so far.
